Through paintings, lithographs, sculptures, personal artifacts, campaign posters, and cartoons, see Douglas in a new light.

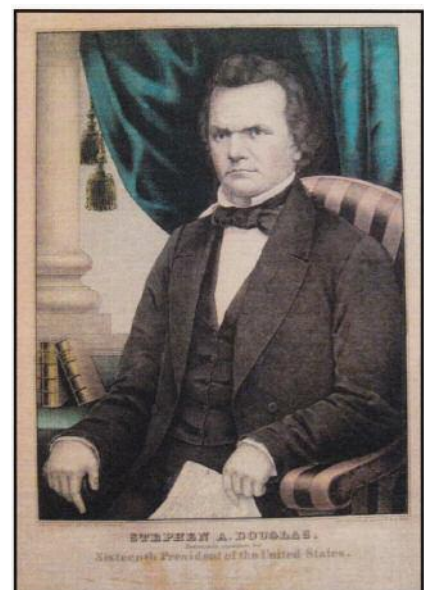
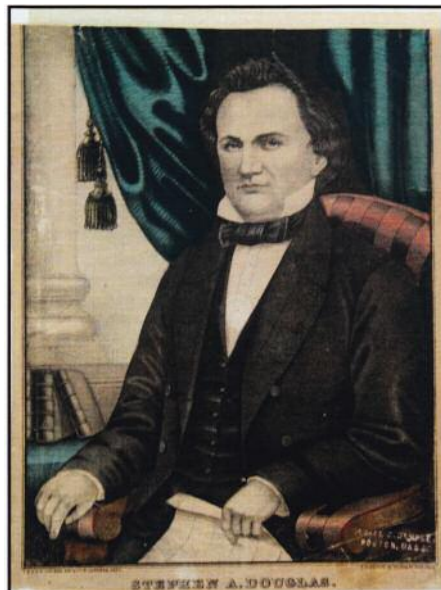
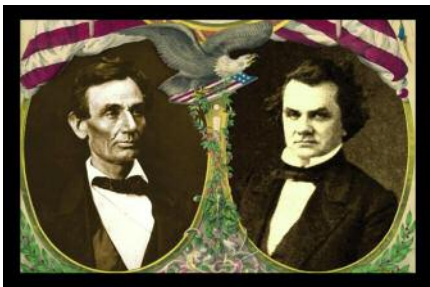
