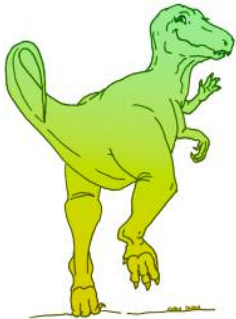
WORLD OF BIRDS

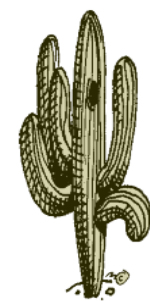

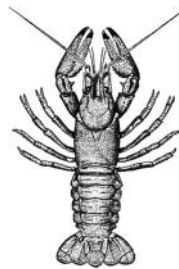

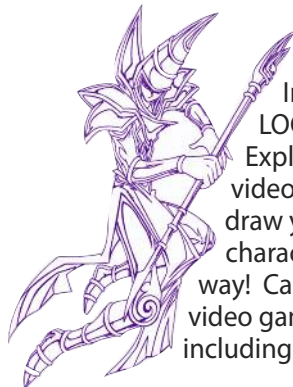

Watercolor Workshop With Joe Fettingis, NWS

Teaching watercolor workshops for over 30 years all over the USA and Canada, Joseph Fettingis has learned what the needs of the student are. The workshop includes 5-6 group demonstrations but the bulk of the workshop focuses on working "one-on-one" with each student. Learn to control moisture in 3 levels. Focus on how colors work, how to move the colors without guessing, and composing and designing your watercolor painting. Learn how to compose negative and positive areas and how to move your values and colors before you paint. The goal of Mr. Fettingis' workshops has always been "each student, no matter what level they are in, needs to go home with more knowledge than when they came in...then my job is done and we both will go home happy!"

Mr. Fettingis is a signature member of the National Watercolor Society and has been published in American Artist magazine, as well as Palette Talk, and International Artist magazines. He has been featured in the books Splash 6, Painting Color, and Best of Watercolors 2 as well as many newspaper articles throughout the US, Canada and Puerto Rico. He regularly lectures, demonstrates and conducts workshops nationally and in Canada. A supply list is available.
