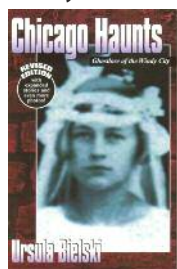

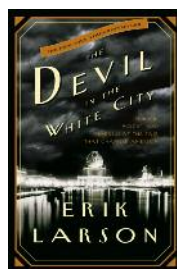
### HAUNTED CHICAGO

Travel the streets and neighborhoods of Chicago and hear about its haunted history, from the phantoms of Fort Dearborn to the St. Valentine's Day Massacre from well-known ghost hunter Ursula Bielski. Tour the city's most supernaturally active sites and delve into the ghosthunter's world at some of Chicago's most actively haunted locations. Tour is partially on and partially off the bus to give you a real feel for the atmosphere of these dark and memorable sites. After lunch at the Rainforest Cafe, travel through the area around the Museum of Science and Industry, site of the 1893 World's Columbian Exposition, on a Chicago Architecture Foundation "Devil and the White City" tour. Even if you haven't read the book about the fair and grizzly mass murder, you'll find this tour intriguing!

Kick off the holiday season on this annual favorite day trip with a new stop! First stop is historic Cedarburg and the annual "Christmas in the Country" fair at Cedar Creek Settlement. The fair features a multitude of food, craft, art and gift vendors scattered throughout the Winery. This year the fair expands to a second location at the recently opened Wisconsin Museum of Quilts and Fiber Arts. A shuttle bus runs between the two locations. Then depart for Elkhart Lake for lunch at the Osthoff Resort decked out for the holidays. After lunch visit the European Christmas Market at the Osthoff Resort. Experience the sights, smells and sounds of a traditional "Christkindlesmarkt" where European gifts, hand-blown glass ornaments and hand-carved wooden items are available for purchase.

Visit Chicago's Museum of Science and Industry for their annual holiday festival. The Museum halls are decked, holiday singers and dancers fuel the festivities, and the sparkle of dozens of decorated trees greet visitors. The Museum's 45-foot Grand Tree takes center stage in the Rotunda with more than 30,000 lights and 1,000 ornaments, and it is surrounded by more than 50 smaller trees—beautifully decorated by volunteers from Chicago's ethnic communities to represent their various cultures and holiday traditions. Stroll through the trees, enjoy intermittent falling "snow" and savor the performances of various dance and choral groups on the Holiday Stage. Enjoy lunch on your own and free time to stroll amongst the holiday displays and through the Museum's world renowned science exhibits.
