Welcome to the Dinosaur Discovery Museum

As you enter the exhibit gallery proceed to your left.
The dinosaur mounts represent the fossil record of the change over time
of meat-eating dinosaurs, theropods, to modern day birds.

The mounts are casts of actual dinosaur fossil bones.
The lighter colored bones indicate the bones of that specific animal that were
found in one location. The light color is the color of the actual fossil bones.

The black bones indicate the ones that were missing from the
original skeleton, and are sculpted to fill in the missing bones.

Each dinosaur is labeled, providing information about each particular animal.

On the walls of the gallery, beginning to your left as you enter, educational panels
provide answers to the most common questions about dinosaurs.

On the lower level of the Museum you will find the Carthage College Institute of
Paleontology. What you will see through the windows of the Lab are
actual dinosaur fossil bones of Little Clint, a juvenile *T-rex*.

The fossils were collected during the 2006 and 2007 Field School
in the Hell Creek Formation of southeastern Montana.

There are children's craft activities and books available in the lower level classroom.
