MILWAUKEE PUBLIC MUSEUM: THE DEAD SEA SCROLLS AND THE BIBLE

Thursday, April 15 • Depart: 8:30 am – Return: 4 pm
“Dead Sea Scrolls and the Bible: Ancient Artifacts, Timeless Treasures” brings together archaeological objects and manuscripts to tell a story 2,000 years in the making. Witness actual Dead Sea Scrolls and other early biblical artifacts to learn how transmission of these early writings has shaped the beliefs of Judaism and Christianity and influenced aspects of Islam. The largest temporary exhibit ever produced by the Milwaukee Public Museum, Dead Sea Scrolls and the Bible, explores the archaeological history of the Holy Land during the period the Scrolls were written, from the third century BCE through the first century CE. The exhibit also tracks the discovery of the first Scrolls and subsequent realization of their extraordinary significance. Lunch at the Milwaukee Public Museum is included.

FIELD MUSEUM: MAMMOTHS AND MASTODONS: TITANS OF THE ICE AGE

Join Kenosha Public Museums Senior Curator of Exhibits and Collections and archaeologist Dan Joyce on a trip to the Field Museum to experience Mammoths and Mastodons: Titans of the Ice Age. Millions of years ago, colossal mammals roamed Europe, Asia and North America. From the gigantic mammoth to the massive mastodon, these creatures have captured the world’s fascination. Meet “Lyuba,” the best-preserved baby mammoth in the world, and discover all that science has learned from her. Journey back to the Ice Age through monumental video installations, roam among saber-toothed cats and giant bears, and wonder over some of the oldest human artifacts in existence. Dan Joyce shares his experience of excavating the Schaefer Mammoth skeleton in Kenosha County.

MADISON IN BLOOM

Friday, May 14 • Depart: 8 am – Return: 6 pm
Enjoy a fragrant spring day in Madison at the University of Wisconsin Arboretum and Olbrich Gardens! The UW Arboretum Longenecker Horticultural Gardens feature more than 2,000 plants including one of the nation's largest collections of lilacs, flowering crabapples (one of the most up-to-date in the country), viburnums, conifers, and dozens of other plant groups. See the lilacs, which should be almost at their peak, on a one-hour guided tour. You'll have time to explore some of the other environments including the forests, prairies and savannas on your own. After lunch at Quivey's Grove, walk the gardens and conservatory at Olbrich Botanical Gardens. Stroll through 16 acres of outdoor display gardens including the Rose Garden, Thai Pavilion and Garden, Sunken Garden, and Perennial Garden. Enjoy a tropical paradise in Olbrich's Bolz Conservatory, a glass pyramid filled with exotic plants and flowers, small birds, a rushing waterfall, and fragrant orchids. Good walking shoes strongly encouraged!



IN THE FOOTSTEPS OF CIVIL WAR MILWAUKEE

Wednesday, May 26 • Depart: 8:30 am – Return: 5 pm
Visit two of Milwaukee's ongoing links to the Civil War with Doug Dammann, Curator of the Civil War Museum, and Lance Herdegen, author and history professor at Carroll University. The journey begins with a behind-the-scenes tour of the buildings and grounds of the Milwaukee Soldiers Home. The facility opened shortly after the end of the Civil War due to the work of a group of Milwaukee women who raised over \$77,000 and worked with the federal government to establish the Soldiers Home. Later in the 19th century, other buildings, including a chapel, library, theater and administration building were constructed. A dozen buildings and several monuments comprise the Milwaukee Soldiers Home Historic District. After lunch at Mader's Restaurant, continue with a guided tour of the Forest Home Cemetery. Established in 1850, Forest Home Cemetery is the final resting place for many of the original founders of Milwaukee including several who served during the Civil War.

Registration: Advance paid registration is required for all classes and trips. Spaces cannot be held without payment. Two weeks advance registration is encouraged for all trips. Friends of the Museums receive discounts on all classes and trips.

BUS TRIPS: A refund may be given if you cancel (14) fourteen days before the bus trip date. No refunds given for cancellations less than (14) fourteen days prior to the date of the bus trip.
