Would you like to take the guesswork out of selecting and mixing watercolors as you begin a painting? In this intensive three-day workshop, nationally



acclaimed artist/teacher Joe Fettingis will focus on the control of color, composition, and techniques to bring students to a higher level of painting skill. Learn how to mix and apply colors, how to control moisture on your palette and brush, and how to create movement, balance, and unity in your painting. The workshop includes 5-6 small demonstrations each day and plenty of painting time. This is a very popular workshop; early registration is strongly encouraged. Limit: 25 students. A supply list is available.

Mr. Fettingis is a signature member of the National Watercolor Society and has been published in *American Artist* magazine, as well as *Palette Talk*, and *International Artist* magazines. He has been featured in the books *Splash 6*, *Painting Color* and *Best of Watercolors 2* as well as many newspaper articles throughout the U.S., Canada and Puerto Rico. He regularly lectures, demonstrates and conducts workshops nationally and in Canada.
