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KENOSHA – New York artist and former Kenoshan Marc Travanti will exhibit selections of his art from the past three decades in a new exhibit, Entanglement, opening July 31 in the Kenosha Public Museum's East Gallery. There will be a free, public reception from 5:30 to 8 p.m. Saturday, July 31, on the second floor Friends Mezzanine at the Museum.

Travanti's contemporary works explore sensuality, ambiguity, and the human body as a means of understanding and appreciation. His medium varies, but the message is the same: Entanglement. These series works evolve, transform, and inform one another. A drawing may inspire a ceramic sculpture; a photograph can lead to an oil painting or sculpture or collage. Stock charts and newspaper images become almost unrecognizable as Travanti wrests them out of context to use in unexpected, compelling ways. Images and objects become symbols, as the artist asks us to consider, question, and make our own connections to one another in an increasingly technological world.

Travanti holds a Bachelor's of Fine Arts degree from the University of Wisconsin Whitewater and a Master's of Fine Arts degree from the University of Colorado Boulder.

The exhibit will be on display through October 28, 2010.
