PUBLIC SAFETY and WELFARE COMMITTEE Minutes of Meeting held on Monday, April 22, 2024

The regular meeting of the Public Safety and Welfare Committee was held on Monday, April 22, 2024 in Room 204. The meeting was called to order at 5:00 PM by Chairperson LaMacchia.

At roll call the following members were present: Alderpersons Haugaard, MacKay, Michalski and Pizzala. Staff members in attendance were Brian Cater, Director of Public Works; Greg Boldt, Deputy Director of Public Works/City Engineer; Katie Elder, Director of Parks; Deputy Police Chief Labatore; Deputy Fire Chief Krueger; Kris Kochman, Community Relations Liaison; Barbara Brattin, Library Director; Alderperson Rose; Alderperson Ferree and Alderperson Kennedy.

CITIZEN COMMENTS: Debra Dixon, 5204 42nd St, spoke on item 5. Alderperson Rose, 4315 68th St, stated that today was crisis intervention team training and he thanked the Police Department. Molly Gray Moores, 6039 14th Avenue, spoke about the 22nd Avenue Uptown Reconstruction project.

Approval of the minutes of the meeting held on April 8, 2024.

It was moved by Alderperson Michalski, seconded by Alderperson Haugaard to approve. Motion passed 5-0.

- Aldermanic Request for 30 Minute Parking 8:00AM to 6:00 Mon-Sat Excluding Holidays on the South Side of 57th Street from 6th Avenue to 50 Feet East of 6th Avenue. (District 2) (Staff Recommends Approval of 90-Day Trial) Public Hearing: No one spoke. It was moved by Alderperson Michalski, seconded by Alderperson Haugaard to approve. Motion passed 5-0.

Subject: Alderperson Request for No Parking on the East side of 55th Avenue from 335 ft South of 43rd Street to 375 ft North of 41st Street (District 10) (Staff Recommends Approval of 90-Day Trial)

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

After the deferral of the original request at the April 22, 2024, Public Safety and Welfare Committee Meeting, staff reviewed feedback received from constituents and Alderperson Kennedy. Staff performed additional site visits to confirm some of the concerns raised and communicated further with Alderperson Kennedy.

Staff recommends modifying the original no parking request to be expanded north of 41st Street and shortened to south of 43rd Street. Staff also recommends modifying the side of parking restriction from the west side to the east side. (Attachment 1-1).

The roadway width is consistent throughout this segment; therefore, the roadway width concerns presented previously are still valid. The modification to the east side of the roadway takes into consideration the mailbox placement on the east side of the road which reduces parking availability while complicating mail delivery.

Staff recommends a 90-day trial for No Parking on the *east* side of 55th Avenue *from 335 ft south of 43rd Street to 375 ft north of 41st Street.*

RECOMMENDATION:

Public Works Engineering staff recommends approval of a 90-day trial to restrict parking as "No Parking" on the east side of 55th Avenue *from 335 ft south of 43rd Street to 375 ft north of 41st Street.*

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Alderperson Kennedy requested Public Works Engineering staff evaluate parking along 55th Avenue north of 45th Street due to the roadway width. Staff determined the roadway width varies between twenty-four and twenty-five (24-25) feet wide which cannot safely support two-way traffic and two-sided parking. There are currently more driveways on the west side of 55th Avenue; therefore, restricting parking on the west side results in more available parking in the area.


Staff recommends a 90-day trial for No Parking on the west side of 55th Avenue from 45th Street to 43rd Street.

TO DECLARE THE MONTH OF MAY 2024 AS "AMYOTROPHIC LATERAL SCLEROSIS (ALS) AWARENESS MONTH"

WHEREAS, Amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS), known by many as Lou Gehrig's disease, is a progressive fatal neurodegenerative disease in which a person's brain loses connection with the muscles, slowly taking away their ability to walk, talk, eat, and eventually breathe; and

WHEREAS, every 90 minutes someone is diagnosed with ALS and someone passes away from ALS; and

WHEREAS, on average, patients diagnosed with ALS only survive two to five years from the time of diagnosis; and

WHEREAS, ALS has no cure; and

WHEREAS, people who have served in the military are more likely to develop ALS and die from the disease than those with no history of military service; and

WHEREAS, securing access to new therapies, durable medical equipment, and communication technologies is of vital importance to people living with ALS; and

WHEREAS, clinical trials play a pivotal role in evaluating new treatments, enhancing quality of life, and fostering assistive technologies for those living with ALS; and

WHEREAS, we celebrate the 10th Anniversary of the Ice Bucket Challenge through a renewed commitment to galvanize public awareness and support funding leading to significant investments in ALS research; and

WHEREAS, the ALS Association, as the largest philanthropic funder of ALS research globally, has committed over \$154 million to support more than 550 projects across the United States and 18 other countries; and

WHEREAS, our commitment to accelerating the pace of discovery remains unwavering, fueled by the hope that one day, ALS will be a livable disease for everyone, everywhere, until we can cure it.

WHEREAS, ALS Awareness Month increases the public's awareness of people with ALS'

dire circumstances, and acknowledges the terrible impact this disease has, not only on the person but on his or her family and the community, and recognizes the research being done to eradicate this disease;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Common Council that May 2024, is declared to be "Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (Als) Awareness Month" in the City of Kenosha. We call upon all Americans to join in supporting ALS research, advocating for increased funding, and standing in solidarity with those affected by this relentless disease.
