Vote In-Person Absentee

In-Person Absentee Voting for the February 20, 2024, Spring Primary Election will be held in Room 104 of City Hall, 625 52nd Street:

- Tuesday, February 6, 2024: 8 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.
- Wednesday, February 7, 2024: 8 a.m. - 7 p.m. (Extended Hours)
- Thursday, February 8, 2024: 8 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.
- Friday, February 9, 2024: 8 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.
- Monday, February 12, 2024: 8 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.
- Tuesday, February 13, 2024: 8 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.
- Wednesday, February 14, 2024: 8 a.m. - 7 p.m. (Extended Hours)
- Thursday, February 15, 2024: 8 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.
- Friday, February 16, 2024: 8 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. (Extended Hours)

Vote Absentee By Mail

Voters can request to vote absentee by mail; requests must include your name, address, mailing address (if different) signature, and copy of Photo ID (if required).

- **Mail** your request to City Clerk, 625 52nd Street, Kenosha, WI 53140.
- **Email** your request to elections@kenosha.org (signature not required).
- **Fax** your request to the City Clerk, 262-653-4023.
- **Online** visit MyVote.WI.gov.

The deadline to request a ballot by mail is 5 p.m. on Thursday, February 15, the Thursday before Election Day, Unless you are indefinitely confined or in the military; then the deadline is 5 p.m. on Friday, February 16, the Friday before Election Day.

If voters meet specific requirements, they are not required to include a copy of Photo ID with an absentee ballot request.

- If you have voted by absentee ballot previously, the City Clerk's office may have your photo ID on file.
- If you have difficulty traveling to the polling place due to age, physical illness, infirmity or disability or live in a nursing home or care facility, you do NOT need to provide a copy of your photo ID to receive an absentee ballot.
- If you are in the military or live permanently overseas, you do NOT need to provide a copy of your photo ID to receive an absentee ballot.

Returning Ballots

DO NOT DROP YOUR BALLOT OFF AT A POLLING PLACE ON ELECTION DAY. All voted ballots must be in the City Clerk's office by 8 p.m. on Election Day, February 20, 2024. **You may not drop off a ballot for someone else.** *

Allow enough time for delivery so your ballot is counted!

- Return it to the City Clerk, 625 52nd Street, Kenosha, WI 53140.
- Mail it and allow enough time for it to be received in the City Clerk's office by 8 p.m. on February 20, 2024. The post office recommends mailing it seven days in advance. Ballots may also be shipped via other delivery methods (FedEx, etc).

DO NOT DROP YOUR BALLOT IN A DROP BOX. You may only deliver your ballot in-person at City Hall or by mail.

Polling Location Changes

The City of Kenosha has increased the total number of polling locations. Additionally, some locations are no longer able to serve due to scheduling conflicts or accessibility requirements. City of Kenosha registered voters received a mailed postcard with updated polling location information. To find your polling location, visit [MyVote.WI.gov](https://www.MyVote.WI.gov). Acceptable Photo ID for Voting

- Wisconsin driver license or ID
- Unexpired Wisconsin driver license or ID receipt
- US passport
- US Uniformed Service Military ID
- Unexpired US Veteran's photo ID

*** Hospitalized and Disabled Voters**

If you are disabled or are in the hospital within seven days before the election, you can designate someone as your agent to bring the ballot to you. The agent then needs to bring the voted ballot back to the City Clerk's office by 8 p.m. on Election Day. The deadline to request this is by 5 p.m. on Election Day.
