KENOSHA – Due to a delay in receiving ballots and influx of requests to mail absentee ballots, early in person absentee voting, which was set to begin tomorrow, March 18th, has been postponed until March 23rd

Early in person absentee voting will be held in Room 202 of the Kenosha Municipal Building on the following days:

Monday-Friday, March 23rd – April 3rd
Saturday, March 28th
8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. (5:00 p.m. on April 3rd)

All voters are encouraged to participate in the Spring Election by voting an absentee ballot by mail. To receive a ballot by mail, requests can be made on myvote.wi.gov, or by email elections@kenosha.org or send a request to City Clerk, 625 52nd Street, Kenosha, WI 53140. Include a copy of acceptable photo ID.

It is very important that voters are aware that open registration ends at 5 p.m. on March 18th. If a voter has moved from their voting residence or is not registered, they can register on myvote.wi.gov or mail their registration accompanied by acceptable proof of residence to the City Clerk at 625 52nd Street, Kenosha, WI 53140.

Missed the deadline? Voters can register during early in person absentee voting or on election day, April 7th, with acceptable proof of residence.

The Wisconsin Elections Commission (WEC) and Wisconsin Department of Health Services have issued guidance that only essential personnel have access to nursing homes and care facilities. Therefore, the St. Catherine Commons polling location will be moved to the Kenosha Public Museum. Voters should continue to check myvote.wi.gov to locate their polling place prior to April 7th to ensure their polling location has not changed since the last election.

The situation concerning COVID-19 and the upcoming elections is fluid and quickly evolving, so guidance changes daily. The WEC is working with federal and state public health officials to determine the most effective guidance to provide to local election officials dealing with this crisis. We will provide additional information as it is available.
