KENOSHA – The City of Kenosha, in conjunction with the consulting engineering firm GRAEF, will host a Public Involvement Meeting from 4:30 to 6:30 p.m. August 28 for the reconstruction of 104th Avenue from 60th Street (Hwy. K) to 52nd Street (Hwy. 158). The meeting will take place at the Kenosha Regional Airport Terminal, 9900 52nd St.

People may access the terminal by traveling north at the intersection of 104th Avenue and 52nd Street on Ruth Harmon Drive. The terminal building is located at the end of Ruth Harmon Drive.

Reconstruction of 104th Avenue is scheduled to begin after Labor Day. The purpose of the project is to reconstruct the severely deteriorated pavement from a rural cross section to an urban cross section. The roadway will be completely reconstructed as a four-lane roadway including curb and gutter.

The meeting will be held in an open house format and representatives from the City of Kenosha and GRAEF will be available to answer questions. Project plans will be available for public review, and information will be provided on the planned improvement, construction schedule and traffic detours. Citizens may view the design, ask questions, exchange information, and view the anticipated impacts for the planned improvements.
