KENOSHA – Citizens are invited to learn more about the Kenosha Innovation Neighborhood (KIN), and share their input on the redevelopment of the former auto manufacturing site in the heart of the City during a public meeting on November 9, 2021.

The City of Kenosha has been working with consultants, local stakeholders and the community for more than six months to develop a framework for the new neighborhood, located between 52nd and 60th Street, east of 30th Avenue. The public is invited to provide comment and feedback during a third public information meeting for the project from 5-7 p.m. Tuesday, November 9 at the former Brown Bank Building, 2222 63rd St.

Presentation of the proposed development concept will begin at 5:30 p.m., followed by questions. The presentation will summarize the community feedback and guidance collected at the first two public meetings and in the hundreds of comments received through a survey on the City's website. All of this input helped to shape the design concepts for the site. Preliminary plans for the neighborhood focus on educational and career development opportunities -- including the creation of next generation jobs -- as well as housing, retail and services. The primary goal of this project is developing talent, driving innovation and creating jobs. Participants attending the meeting will be asked for additional input to help finalize the plans for the first phase of the development.
