KENOSHA – City Hall will be closed for business on Tuesday, November 3, 2020 due to the Presidential and General Election.

City Hall is closed for business except for:

- Voters who are dropping off their absentee ballot by 8 p.m.
- Individuals inquiring about hospitalized voters, sequestered jurors or new Wisconsin residents who recently moved here from another state and don't qualify for the 28 day residency requirement.
- Media and observers for Absentee Central Count.

The City Clerk's office has installed six new official ballot drop boxes throughout the City, which voters may use to return their completed ballots. Voters are encouraged to use the drop boxes, or hand deliver their ballots to City Hall, as it may be too late to return ballots via U.S. mail. Drop box locations include:

- City Hall, 625 52nd Street
- Northside Library, 1500 27th Avenue
- Kenosha Transit Facility, 4303 39th Avenue
- Kenosha Water Utility, 4401 Green Bay Road
- Southwest Library, 7979 38th Avenue
- Uptown Library, 2419 63rd Street.

The last pickup on November 3 will be at 7 p.m., and then the boxes will be locked.

DO NOT DROP YOUR BALLOT OFF AT A POLLING PLACE ON ELECTION DAY. All voted ballots must be in the City Clerk's office by 8 p.m. on election day. Anyone delivering a ballot after 7 p.m., must hand deliver it to City Hall.

Polls will be open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. on November 3. Voters may register and vote at their polling place on election day. They may not register or vote at City Hall on election day.

Voters heading to the polls on election day will notice several safety measures the City has put in place. Police officers will be monitoring each polling place and at City Hall.

Because of the COVID pandemic, plexiglass barriers will be placed between the workers and voters, and citizens will be instructed to maintain proper social distancing practices. The City also will provide hand sanitizer stations.
