For the first nomination period of the 2023-24 school year, six students met the criteria to be presented with an award. These students were:

Isaac Gray is a senior at Tremper High School. Isaac has extraordinary drive to take on rigorous AP and Honors classes. He is involved in FBLA, AAMI and volunteers at food banks. He is currently working with a Marquette professor on a research opportunity. Isaac always goes above and beyond to take initiative to better himself as a student and individual. He has a positive influence on the school community and will accomplish great things.

Naroly DeLeon Guzman is an eighth grade student at Washington Middle School. Naroly is a student who moved to Kenosha mid-way through her seventh grade school year. She was instantly a leader, showing others how to make friends, include others and treats everyone with respect. The character of Washington Middle School was instantly elevated by her presence. Shortly after Naroly started attending Washington Middle School, the school registered a few new students who were brand new to the United States. She would introduce herself, helping to translate along the way. She was always greeting new students and explaining that she knows how it feels to be new to a school. Naroly is a part of the first-day tour because she always has a kind word to new students. She volunteers to take anyone new to their classes on their first day, she offers direction and assistance in Spanish and also offers to sit with them at lunch. She has earned a 4.0 GPA in middle school. Kindness is Naroly's character. She has a warmth and ability to relate to others that is not found often at her age. Naroly is making our community a better place.

Yanira Herrera-Leon is a fourth grade student at Frank Elementary. Yanira is kind to all of her classmates and always lends a helpful hand. She is a hard worker and trustworthy. She has grown significantly in academics and in her social skills.

Layla Powell is a second grader at Frank Elementary School. Layla has made a positive impact within her classroom. She is a character leader of empathy. Layla's compassion for others is remarkable and she often helps others with special needs.
