KENOSHA – The City of Kenosha’s Keep Kenosha Beautiful “Adopt-A-Spot” program is inviting the public to view six of its gardens in the first “Gardens After Five” event from 5 to 7 p.m. Thursday July 14, 2022.

Visitors will enjoy the beauty of the gardens — many of which are reaching peak color. Those who visit all six gardens will be entered into a drawing to win a Kwik Trip gift card. The winner need not be present to win.

This year the gardens featured are within blocks of Kenosha’s Lake Michigan shore. Each of the gardens are cared for by volunteer gardeners. The gardens can be visited in any order convenient.

- Union Park, 4500 Seventh Avenue (snacks will be available at this site)

The volunteer gardeners will greet visitors and answer questions about their garden. The six gardens are a sampling of the 23 active “Adopt-A-Spot” gardens throughout the city.
