KENOSHA – A special election will take place on Tuesday, April 30 to fill the vacant seat for Representative to the 64th Assembly District. Only voters residing in the 64th Assembly District are eligible to vote in the special election. If you are unsure if you are eligible to vote in this election, visit myvote.wi.gov or contact the City Clerk at elections@kenosha.org or 262-653-4020.

The following are acceptable forms of identification for voting:

- A Wisconsin DOT-issued driver license, even if driving privileges are revoked or suspended.
- A Wisconsin DOT-issued ID card.
- Military ID card issued by a U.S. uniformed service.
- A U.S. passport.

All of the above must be unexpired, or expired after November 6, 2018.

- An unexpired Wisconsin DOT-issued driving or ID card receipt.
- An unexpired veteran's ID card issued by the Veterans Health Administration of the Federal Department of Veterans Affairs.
- An ID card issued by a Wisconsin accredited university or college that contains date of issuance, signature of student, and an expiration date no later than two years after date of issuance. Also, the university or college ID must be accompanied by a

separate document that proves enrollment.

Visit Room 104 and/or Room 105 of the Municipal Building, 625-52nd Street, during the following times:

Monday, April 8 to Friday, April 12, 2019: 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

Monday, April 15 to Friday, April 19, 2019: 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

Monday, April 22 to Thursday, April 25, 2019: 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

Friday, April 26, 2019: 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Request a Ballot by Mail

Send a request for a ballot by email to elections@kenosha.org; fax to 262-653-4023; online at myvote.wi.gov, or mail/drop off: City Clerk, 625-52nd Street, Room 105, Kenosha, WI 53140.

Include with your request, a picture or copy of your photo ID and include your name, home address and mailing address if it is different. Deadline is 5 p.m. Thursday, April 25, 2019*.

You do not need to submit a picture or copy of your photo ID if you are indefinitely confined to your home or other facility due to age, physical illness or infirmity; or if you are disabled for an indefinite period; or if you are in the military, live permanently overseas, or are classified as a confidential voter.

Returning Your Ballot

All ballots must be received by the City Clerk by 8 p.m. on April 30, 2019.

When voting by mail, be sure to RETURN YOUR BALLOT ASAP. You can drop it off or mail it to the City Clerk at 625 52nd Street, Room 105, Kenosha, WI 53140.

If you are mailing it, allow 2-7 days for the USPS to deliver it. DO NOT DROP YOUR BALLOT OFF AT A POLLING PLACE!

**The last day to request an absentee ballot by mail for indefinitely confined electors and military electors is April 26, 2019 by 5 p.m. The last day for sequestered jurors and hospitalized voters to apply for an absentee ballot by agent is April 30, 2019 by 5 p.m.*
