## Absentee Ballots & Early Voting

### Photo ID for Voting

- Wisconsin driver license or ID\*
- Unexpired Wisconsin driver license or ID receipt
- US passport\*
- College photo ID & proof of enrollment document\*\*
- US Uniformed Service Military ID\*
- Unexpired US Veteran's photo ID\*\*\*
- For more examples of acceptable photo ID visit [bringit.wi.gov](http://bringit.wi.gov) or [myvote.wi.gov](http://myvote.wi.gov).

\*Expired after 11/8/16.

\*\*Issued by a WI college with issue date, signature, and expired date within 2 years of issue date. Must also prove enrollment.

\*\*\*Issued by VHA or VA.

### Free Photo ID for Voting

You can get a free state ID card from the Division of Motor Vehicles if you do not already have a Wisconsin driver license/state ID. The card will be sent to you through the mail. You will receive a receipt that is valid for 45 days that you can use until your card arrives. Visit [bringit.wi.gov](http://bringit.wi.gov) for more information.

### Can't Come in to Early Vote? We Can Send a Ballot to you!

You need to send or drop off a request with a copy of your photo ID. Be sure to list your name, address, mailing address (if different) and signature.

- **Mail** your request to City Clerk, 625-52nd Street, **Room 105**, Kenosha, WI 53140.
- **Email** your request to [elections@kenosha.org](mailto:elections@kenosha.org).
- **Fax** your request to City Clerk, 262-653-4023.
- **On-line** at [myvote.wi.gov](http://myvote.wi.gov) to make the request that your ballot be sent to you.
- All voted ballots must be received in the City Clerk's office by 8 pm on election day. Ballots can be dropped off, sent via US Mail or shipped via other delivery methods (FedEx, etc.).

### Some Voters do Not Need to Include a Copy of their Photo ID with a Request to Send a Ballot

If you are indefinitely confined (*have difficulty traveling to the polling place due to age, physical illness, infirmity or disability*) or live in a nursing home or care facility, you do NOT need to provide a copy of your photo ID to receive an absentee ballot. If you are in the military or live permanently overseas, you do NOT need to provide a copy of your photo ID to receive an absentee ballot.

### Returning Ballots

REMEMBER, all voted ballots must be in the City Clerk's office by 8 pm on election day. Allow enough time for delivery so that your ballot is counted!

**The Deadline to Request that We Send a Ballot to you is 5 pm on the Thursday Before Election Day. UNLESS you are indefinitely confined or in the military. Then the deadline is 5 pm on the Friday before election day.**

### In the Hospital?

If you are in the hospital within 7 days before the election, you can designate someone as your agent to bring the ballot to you. The agent then needs to bring the voted ballot back to the City Clerk's office by 8 pm on election day. The deadline to request this is by 5 pm on election day.
