SECTION 8 TENANT-BASED VOUCHER PROGRAM

What is the Section 8 Housingto-Work Tenant-Based Voucher Program?

- ◆ The Section 8 Housing-to-Work Tenant-Based Voucher Program is a program designed to:
 - keep targeted family members employed by
 - assisting these families with monthly rent payments
 - providing access to short term loans for immediate needs such as car repairs
 - providing tenant counseling
 - providing housing search assistance
 - working with landlords to provide decent, safe and sanitary housing
 - establishing realistic future and employment related goals
 - securing appropriate financing for first time homebuyers

Who is Eligible for Services?

Families must meet the following criteria to qualify for services through the Section 8 Housing-to-Work Tenant-Based Voucher Program:

- Families must be willing to work, or attend school or participate in a W2 Program
- ◆ Families must be eligible to receive, are currently receiving, or have received services funded by the TANF (Temporary Assistance for Needy Families) Program within the preceding two years.
- Tenant-based housing assistance must be determined to be critical to the family's ability to successfully obtain or retain employment; and
- ◆ The family must not already be receiving tenant-based assistance under Section 8 of the United States Housing Act of 1937.
- To be eligible, families must be on the Kenosha Housing Authority's Section 8 Waiting List.

About the Services Offered: Tenant Counseling

A team of professionals are working together to provide informative and useful facts to families who participate in the Section 8 Housing-to-Work Tenant-Based Voucher Program. The Tenant Counseling committee is preparing a curriculum to present at regularly scheduled sessions for families participating in the program.
