On July 6, 2022 at approximately 10:00 PM, Kenosha Police responded to another shots fired complaint in the 4900 block of 36th Avenue. While investigating the scene, a 43-year-old male with a gunshot wound was reported at a local hospital. The victim sustained a serious but non-life-threatening injury, and he has since been released from the hospital.

This is an open and active investigation and there are no suspects in custody at this time. It is not yet known if this shooting is directly related to the recent shootings on July 4 & July 5. Our investigators continue to work with law enforcement agencies in both Wisconsin and Illinois to find answers and hold those responsible, accountable.

“We need community involvement and we ask for your assistance in stopping this senseless violence from continuing”, said Interim Chief of Police Eric Larsen. “Year to date, KPD has arrested:

- 53 people for CCW
- 41 people for felon in possession of a firearm
- 18 people for aggravated assault with a firearm

We have seized 142 firearms, all of which have been related to a crime or from a person that could not legally possess a firearm.”
