These electrifying performances are on stage at Veterans Memorial Park, located at 54th Street and Sixth Avenue. The free public concerts take place at 11:30 a.m. and 6 p.m. every Thursday through August 31.

July 20: Robert Davis – lead singer of R Gang, full band will play at night.

July 27: Keith Richard – an acoustic singer/songwriter solo act.

August 3: Rick Lindy Duo – performing rock and roll hits of the 1950s, '60s and '70s as well as surf, rock-a-billy and original songs. Full band will play at night.

August 10: Unity Duo – old roots, rock and reggae along with original music. Full band will play at night.

August 17: Jaren Gray from Yankee Cowboy – performs country rock.

August 24: Johnny Lyons solo – combining influences of rock and roll, country blues, soul, and rock-a-billy

July 20: R Gang – talented vocalists and musicians in the Midwest.

July 27: Libido Funk Circus - origin dates back to 1996, over the years they added two female singers and expanded their repertoire to include music from '60s to current hits and various musical genres.

August 3: Rick Lindy & The Wild Ones - performing rock and roll hits of the 1950s, '60s and '70s as well as surf, rock-a-billy and original songs.

August 10: Unity – old roots, rock and reggae favorites along with original music.

August 17: Dwayne Dopsie & The Zydeco Hellraisers - the group is #29 on the top 100 reasons people come back to Louisiana.

August 24: Johnny Lyons & The Pride – performs old-time rock and roll and soul.

August 31: Infinity – formed in 1985 as not only a Journey Tribute band, but one of the top-drawing cover bands in the Midwest.
