Location: 5522 26th Avenue

The Department of Public Works, Engineering Division, has opened up bids for the above referenced project. Engineer's Estimate was \$26,000,000.

This project consists of a 3-story office building consisting of approximately 63,000 square feet. The structural system includes a rammed aggregate pier ground improvement system, conventional footings and foundations and a structural steel frame. The building exterior is clad with aluminum framed curtain wall, storefront, and terra cotta panels. The project has an atrium with a smoke exhaust system. The atrium, adjacent collaboration rooms and common areas will be fully finished out. Tenant spaces will not receive any finishes. There will be several outdoor rooftop patio (balcony) spaces. The 3.5-acre site will include a surface parking lot, outdoor plaza with amphitheater, landscaping and a paved area for food-trucks. Provisions are being made for a future photovoltaic array on the rooftop, as well as electric vehicle charging stations in the surface lot.

It is recommended that this contract be awarded to Miron Construction, Neenah, Wisconsin in the amount of \$21,432,520 plus \$2,143,252, in contingency for unforeseen conditions (if needed) for a total award amount of \$23,575,772. Funding is from State of Wisconsin Neighborhood Investment Grant (\$14,000,000), \$2,990,999 (New Market Tax Credit Equity) and \$6,584,773 (TID #19 Funds).

The project is anticipated to begin in spring 2024 and will be completed by July 1, 2025 unless weather impacts working days.

for Right-of-Way Acquisition Associated with the 22<sup>nd</sup> Avenue Uptown Reconstruction project (60<sup>th</sup> Street to 65<sup>th</sup> Street). (District 2, 7, & 12)

### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

The original Transportation Project Plat was approved at the October 9, 2023, Public Works Committee and October 16, 2023, Common Council meetings. Upon field staking of the approved project plat the following revisions are being requested:

- 1. 2207 60<sup>th</sup> Street (Kenosha Gas Stop): Reduce right-of-way to keep the existing sign on private property.
- 2. 2204 60<sup>th</sup> Street (Multi-Tennant Business Building) and 2224 60<sup>th</sup> Street (Jockey): Additional right-of-way to allow for standard sidewalk width.

#### Background from Original Request


As part of the 22<sup>nd</sup> Avenue Uptown Reconstruction project from 60<sup>th</sup> Street to 65<sup>th</sup> Street, right-of-way acquisition is required at eight parcels. The acquisitions are due to existing sidewalks currently being outside the existing right-of-way, installation of public sidewalks, updating ADA curb ramps to current standards, and proposed monument features. The right-of-way acquisitions needs are shown on the attached Transportation Project Plat.

Once the Transportation Project Plat is approved and recorded, the property segments to be acquired will be appraised to determine appropriate property owner payment.

Right-of-way acquisition for this project is included in the Capital Improvement Plan (IN-17-002) with \$125,000.00 allocated.
